Primary Purpose

Provide project coordination and support for the ongoing development and implementation of a range of key early year partnership projects and programs including Child and Family Learning Centres.

Level of Responsibility/Direction and Supervision

The occupant is responsible for completion of assigned tasks and expected to operate with autonomy in day-to-day activities with broad direction from the supervisor together with guidance and information from senior managers within the team.

It is the responsibility of the occupant to actively participate, promote and model behaviours which are consistent with the Department's commitment to the safety and wellbeing of children and young people. This includes the prevention, identification and reporting of child abuse and behaviours which are not consistent with the Department's values.



The occupant is responsible for complying with all Agency policies and procedures, including those relating to fraud and corruption control, record management, confidentiality, conduct and behaviour, mandatory reporting, education, training and assessment.

The Department has a range of delegations across the operational portfolio's which include Finance, People Services and Support (HR) and Facilities. The occupant is responsible for ascertaining the delegations that are assigned to these duties and is expected to exercise any applicable delegations prudently and in accordance with a range of Acts, Regulations, Awards, administrative authorities and functional arrangements.

Primary Duties

- 1. Assist with the development, implementation and co-ordination of identified operational projects and programs, including monitoring of projects and reporting of program outcomes and data as required.
- 2. Provide advice and undertake research into a range of project and programs together with the provision of executive support to committees and project teams.
- 3. Collaborate and negotiate with stakeholders on early years projects and programs including supporting the implementation and operation of Child and Family Learning Centres across the Network.
- 4. Prepare written documentation, including preparation of project documentation, departmental reports, briefing notes, and correspondence in relation to early years projects including Child and Family Learning Centres.
- 5. The incumbent can expect to be allocated duties, not specifically mentioned in this document, that are within the capacity, qualifications and experience normally expected from persons occupying positions at this classification level.
- 6. In accordance with the *Work Health and Safety Act 2012* the incumbent will actively participate in and contribute to the maintenance of safe working conditions and practices, including the development and implementation of improvement initiatives, safeguarding practices and all mandatory training requirements.

Selection Criteria

The following specific selection criteria must be addressed by candidates. The nominated position objective and duties contained in this statement of duties must also be used to assist in the interpretation of these selection criteria.

- 1. Demonstrated project management skills including the ability to identify and synthesise relevant issues and priorities together with the ability to exercise sound judgement to ensure the successful delivery of project outcomes.
- 2. Demonstrated high level interpersonal skills including sound liaison and

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- negotiation skills with the capacity to interact and liaise effectively with staff and stakeholders at all levels.
- 3. Demonstrated capacity to work independently, develop consistent processes and manage a wide range of tasks with competing and changing priorities, within identified time frames.
- 4. High level verbal and written communication skills, including the ability to prepare clear, concise project documentation, high quality meeting minutes; and other user-friendly written outputs.
- 5. High level personal skills of initiative, innovation, self-motivation and flexibility and the capacity to work as a member of a team.
- 6. A demonstrated capacity to commit to the Department's values, with the ability to apply them through individual behaviours and actions.

Requirements

Registration/licences that are essential requirements of this role must remain current and valid at all times whilst employed and the status of these may be checked at any time during employment. It is the employee's responsibility to advise the Department if there is any change to the status of a registration/licence.
